## Year 1 Growing Homework Project - Summer Term 1 (April - May 2014)

- Children must complete at least 1 activity from rows a, b, and c. They must choose which activities to try and how many to do. Children may also come up with their own ideas even if they are not on the grid.
- The first project must be completed by Friday 25<sup>th</sup> April 2014. The second project must be handed in by Friday 9<sup>th</sup> May 2014 and the third project by Friday 23<sup>rd</sup> May 2014. (Additional projects that the children choose to complete can be handed in as and when they are completed.)
- Remember in addition to these homework tasks all pupils should be reading 5 times a week and practising their spellings.
