

# Using did, done, was and were

## Did or done?

Sometimes we confuse **did** and **done** and find it difficult to decide when to use them.

We **did** all of our work – simple past tense.

He **has** already **done** his work – present perfect tense.

We **have done** many things – present perfect tense.

No one **had done** that before – past perfect tense.
