Why Jaguars are endangered!

Jaguars eat a variety of prey that includes more than 85 species range-wide. Jaguar prey species include peccaries, capybaras, pacas, agoutis, deer, opossum, rabbits, armadillos, caimans, turtles, livestock, as well as various reptiles, birds and fish species.



Where do Jaguars live?

Jaguars often live in tropical low-lying habitats close to lakes, rivers and inland wetlands. In the past, jaguars could be found from the south-western USA to the scrub grasslands of Argentina. Sadly, they have lost half of their historic range mainly due to habitat loss they also sneak around everywhere and are very cautious and really stealthy so they can catch their prey.



Does Jaguars have any predators?

Jaguars don't have any predator because they are known as apex predators and are at the top of the food chain meaning that they have no natural predators in the wild.
