

In the past when fighting has stopped for brief periods, organisations like UNICEF have taken the opportunity to reach Syrian families. They deliver life-saving food and medical aid. This winter Aleppo and other cities are cut off again. The bombing has been fierce.

Clear paragraphs

Thousands of children have lost their homes and their families. They are forced to flee to neighbouring countries. Many head to Lebanon in search of safety.

Mix of facts and opinions


In the refugee camps in Lebanon children live in tents without heating in the bitter winter. The children get ill.

UNICEF is supplying children with warm clothes and blankets, but their long term future relies on the war ending.

Glossary: UNICEF stands for the United Nations Children's Fund. It is responsible for providing humanitarian and developmental aid to children worldwide.

Remember to:

- Make your **headline** short and snappy
- Summarise your story in the first sentence
- Write in the third person and the past tense
- Use paragraphs to help the reader clearly understand the information
- Use quotes to make your report more interesting
- Use facts (the 5 Ws)
- Include a conclusion, with your opinion (what message or point of view would you like to give to your reader?)



When someone reads your article, they should be able to answer the following:

- 1. What is the article about?
- 2. Who is involved in the story?
- 3. When did the events take place?
- 4. Where did the events take place?
- 5. Why is this happening?


Plan a news article about Ahmet's journey to London.
