We believe our staff can only provide their best if we help them to look after themselves and their own well-being. All staff have been invited to well-being

We have developed a 'Behaviour Working Party' who are meeting regularly to discuss our whole school approach to behaviour. We aim to build a more holistic approach to behaviour which continues to take into account the needs of our children. BEHAVIOUR & ATTITUDES

Develop a whole school approach to mental health and emotional wellbeing which places a focus on ensuring all members of our community are thriving.

Ensure our pupils demonstrate exceptional behaviour and the relationships among pupils and staff reflect our positive and respectful culture; pupils are safe and feel safe.

After half term we are delivering our 'What Happens At The Point Of Not Understanding' programme. This will develop healthy responses and resilience when they are struggling. If will help children to know that not understanding something is normal and it is ok to ask for help to support you to understand. Children will become more aware of what their brains need to feel safe. They will also develop a basic understanding of the functions of different parts of the brain such as the frontal cortex.

The infroduction of our online system for recording behaviour and safeguarding allows us to analyse data to identify trends and training needs. We are also able to consistently track the behaviour across the school. "We do meditation and breathing exercises everyday, just a few minutes makes us feel ready to learn." Too often we underestimate the power of a touch, a smile, a kind word, a listening ear, an honest compliment, or the smallest act of caring, all of which have the potential to turn a life around.
