Pencil case (KS2 only).




Including Pen, Pencil, Rubber, Ruler, Colouring Pens/Pencils & if you can a Glue stick & Safe scissors.

RSE Policy Consultation

Thank you for your responses to the survey, the consultation period has now ended. Your feedback has helped to shape the policy. We have also consulted with all staff and our school governors.

Below is a summary of the outcome:





Do you agree with the Relationships Education content in the draft policy?



The important lessons you teach your child about healthy relationships, looking after themselves and staying safe, are respected and valued under this new curriculum. Teaching at school will complement and reinforce the lessons you teach your child as they grow up. We have acknowledged your concerns and would like to assure you that all RSE Education topics will be taught tailored to the age, physical and emotional maturity of our pupils.

You have the right to withdraw your child from the puberty and conception topics that will be taught in **Year 5** • and 6. These are the <u>only</u> topics you have the option to withdraw your child from. Parents will be informed prior to the start of these lessons and given an opportunity to view the resources before their children. The Science • curriculum in all maintained schools also includes content on human development, including reproduction, which there is no right to withdraw from.

Relationships Education, however, is statutory for **all** children. There is no right to withdraw from Relationships Education.

Following the new statutory framework, when discussing families we will include families that reflect the society in which we live. Including: single parent families, LGBT parents, families headed by grandparents, adoptive parents, foster parents/carers amongst other structures.


