

# **Sports Premium**

#### What is the Sports Premium?

The Government is providing funding for schools to improve their sports provision. This funding is being jointly provided by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport, with money going directly to primary schools to spend on improving the quality of sport and PE for all their children. In 2016/17, Handsworth received £9,800.

#### Purpose of funding

Schools have to spend the sport funding on improving their provision of PE and sport and they have the freedom to choose how they do this.

### How we intend to spend our allocation

- Membership with WFSSN (Waltham Forest School Sports Network) ensuring opportunities for CPD training, new resources, curriculum support and competition.
- Furthering competitive opportunities in KS1 and the chance to try new sports.
- Ensuring all children have the opportunity of extra-curricular clubs by offering Pupil Premium children free places.
- Enhanced equipment to enable excellent delivery of clubs, lessons, training and competition. Improving the curriculum provision.
- Continuing to providing an appropriate and broad range of competitive sports and experiences for all ages and abilities, while taking advantage of the developing interest in sports such as hockey and rugby with more clubs and opportunities.
- Purchasing water proof jackets for sports teams.
- Purchasing new football kits for the girls and boys teams, enough for two teams each.

## How we spent this academic year's allocation

- Continuing to increase the competition participation with cover supply for PE subject leader Furthering competitive opportunities in KS1 and the chance to try new sports.
- Acquiring a resource combining maths and P.E Active Maths.
- Ensuring all children have the opportunity of extra-curricular clubs by offering Pupil Premium children free places.
- Enhanced equipment to enable excellent delivery of clubs, lessons, training and competition.
- Continuing to providing an appropriate and broad range of competitive sports and experiences for all ages and abilities. CPD training enabled with cover supply for PE subject leader Power of an active school.
- Athletics coaching for years 2-6
- Transport for swimming lesson Year 4
- Transport for competitions including to London Youth Games
- WFSSN Membership

### How it made a difference to PE and sport participation

- School received the Gold Sports Mark for the second year running.
- Allowing all children to access clubs and physical opportunities.
- Increased motivation and enjoyment in sport Sports Council and others have led lunch time clubs (ten pin bowling, dance, skipping)
- Increased opportunity to try new sports (cricket, golf, value games)
- Increased competition and success stories have inspired children to try new sports and enter competition.
- Borough champions in Hockey and Rugby. Both teams represented the borough at the London Youth Games.
- Further parental involvement due to success, equipment available and children interest (table tennis, running, rugby and hockey).
- Some children have joined a sports club due to their involvement at school (e.g hockey, netball, running)
- Increased participation in table tennis. Sports council to organise year group competitions.
- Interest in athletics and motivation to improve through athletics coachesMore children able to participate in competition due to more kit being available.
- Further connection with the school community and increased pride when wearing the sports kits.
- Opportunity to build relationships with peers (football, hockey).
- More confident and competent staff
- Positive impact on whole school environment
- Sport update assemblies to promote the achievements and opportunities
- Maintain children's positive attitudes to PE
- Maintained high level of pupil participation
- Linking curriculum (P.E and Maths) with Maths of the Day. Used for support groups, in class and within both P.E. and Maths lessons.
